ABOUT *Milton*

ilton is a biographical work in movement based on the life of Homewood-bred attorney Milton Raiford. Defending those considered to be some of the most dangerous and fruitless individuals in society, his bold, fast talking character has made him one of the most controversial and confrontational lawyers in Pittsburgh. Choreographer Kaylin Horgan met Raiford in 2011, and he quickly became one of the most influential people in her life. Set to an original score by Treble NLS and Brittney Chantele, the evening-length work focuses on episodes from Raiford's life that fueled his dedication to unconditional love.



ARTIST BIO

Kaylin Horgan, a Pittsburgh native, attended Pittsburgh's Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) High School, and Point Park University. She traveled internationally with Pearlann Porter's Pillow Project, performing with world renowned jazz musicians. During her six seasons as Artistic Assistant of August Wilson Center Dance Ensemble, Kaylin worked with choreographers Kyle Abraham, Robert Battle, Sidra Bell, and Camille A. Brown. She currently dances with Antonio Brown Dance and Wylliams Henry Contemporary Dance Company. She teaches modern dance at CAPA.



ARTIST STATEMENT

My mission is to evoke conversations that tackle difficult social topics by using the art of storytelling through dance-based performances. Through the exploration of modern dance, character development, and social psychology, I am committed to making art that is reflective of the contemporary human experience and takes steps towards community healing. For me, artistic gatherings are a reason to unite unlikely communities, provoking empathy, patience, and hope.

My choreographic and performance work is rooted in modern and contemporary dance styles and is heavily influenced by my more recent experience creating choreography for musical theater. My vision is to utilize the influence of the theatrical format in my work, using storyboards, extensive background research, and Method Acting exercises to compel particular emotions and authentic performances.

My strengths lie in my extensive professional dance experience. For over 10 years, I have directed, produced, and choreographed my own original productions, and have cultivated a strong ability to collaborate and utilize the large network of artists and supporters with







whom I have developed solid relationships over the years.

I first met Milton over a decade ago. He was assigned to me as a dance partner for a fundraising competition at the August Wilson Center. Dancing with Milton was

the first time I realized that dance has the power to heal. I am compelled to use my position of influence to tell Milton's story because his life is a testimony to overcoming what seem to be insurmountable odds.

Through this work, I am determined to tell the story of his undeniable light and the passion he has for his faith and community, his journey through the harsh realities of the world, and his personal tale of triumph and ultimate redemption through service.




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SEAN HORGAN (Animator)

NEW HAZLETT THEATER SAFETY PROTOCOLS

The New Hazlett Theater staff has been committed to every person's safety during the filming of *Milton* and has established safety protocols in consultation with other local theater organizations, health professionals, and with information provided by the CDC and local government.

Here are some of the ways that our artists and crew were protected during the making of this production:

- Artists and crew were given lifestyle surveys prior to rehearsal and filming to evaluate risk and prepare mitigation plans.
- Artists and crew were asked to self-isolate during the weeks leading up to and during the filming process.
- Artists and crew were tested for COVID-19 at regular intervals during the rehearsal and filming process.
- Artists and crew were questioned about activities and symptoms each time they entered the building.
- All rehearsals were conducted with actors and crew in appropriate PPE provided by New Hazlett Theater in consultation with health professionals.
- All production crew was socially distanced throughout the production.
- No other individuals were permitted on set during filming.
- All singing in the production was pre-recorded with each singer in isolation. No singing was done during the filming of the performance.

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
