ABOUT THE BOXCAR CHILDREN BOOK SERIES

The Boxcar Children book series tells the story of four orphaned children, Henry, Jessie, Violet, and Benny. They create a home for themselves in an abandoned boxcar in the forest. They eventually meet their grandfather, who is a wealthy and kind man (although the children had believed him to be cruel). The children decide to live with the grandfather, who moves the beloved boxcar to his backyard so the children can use it as a playhouse. This script takes elements from several of the books in the series.

An avid reader and writer from an early age, Gertrude Chandler Warner dreamed of becoming a writer from the time she was a little girl. She would write stories for her Grandfather Carpenter and give him one as a gift each Christmas. Inspired by her childhood experiences of living across the street from the railroad tracks, Gertrude imagined how amazing it might be to live in



the caboose of a freight car. This idea prompted the creation of the original book *The Boxcar Children* which was the first book in the series in 1924.

A lifelong resident of Putnam, Connecticut Gertrude became a first-grade teacher at the Putnam Grammar School for 32 years. She wanted her students to love reading as much as she did. Using input from her students, Warner made *The Boxcar Children* to be fun and easy to read.

It was rewritten in 1942 at an entry level to serve as a children's school reader—and to entice the nonreader. The books have captured the hearts of children who demanded more stories in the series. Warner's original 19 titles are still in publication. Today, the complete series includes upwards of 150 titles with the subsequent books in the series being written by ghostwriters. Two authors, Stacia Deutsch and Rhody Cohen, are credited as the ghostwriters behind "many of the Boxcar Children books."

The National Education Association named the original book one of its "Teachers' Top 100 Books for Children," and the original novel was also ranked among the all-time "Top 100 Chapter Books", or children's novels, in a survey by the School Library Journal.

The books have sold 50 million print copies over the span of decades. In 2004, The Gertrude Chandler Warner Boxcar Museum opened in Putnam, Connecticut, which is appropriately housed in an authentic 1920s New Haven Railroad boxcar.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The Boxcar Children series of children's books have been a staple of early childhood libraries, classrooms, and home bookshelves for over 80 years. I believe the reason for this longevity is the inherent theme that Henry introduces through the line, "We Alden's stick together like glue." We all spend our life seeking family and friends that we can have lasting, healthy relationships with. We begin this story with the children becoming orphans through the sudden death of their parents. The story unfolds with very simple lessons about how we can deal with challenges of loss by relying on those people around us that we identify as our "glue." The children show us how to focus on the needs of their siblings, not themselves. In taking care of each other, they begin to move forward through their loss, ultimately finding new relationships to celebrate.

So, join us as we follow the Alden children through their challenges in the Boxcar, and when you leave them to return to your own homes, I hope you can spend some time recognizing the "glue" you have in your own lives. And don't forget to be ready for those new relationships that can help your "glue" stick tighter!

Children's Books

The Boxcar Children by Gertrude Chandler Warner

Henry, Jessie, Violet, and Benny are brothers and sisters. They're orphans too, and the only way tney can stay together is to make it on their own. When the children find an abandoned boxcar in the woods, they decide to call it home--and become the Boxcar Children!

Encyclopedia Brown (series) by Donald J. Sobol

Leroy Brown, aka Encyclopedia Brown, is Idaville neighborhood's ten-year-old star detective. With o fhte playwright wasn'an uncanny knack for trivia, he solves mysteries for the neighborhood kids through his own detective agency.

My Father's Dragon (series) by Ruth Gannett

When Elmer Elevator hears about the plight of an overworked and underappreciated baby flying dragon, he stows away on a ship and travels to Wild Island to rescue the dragon.

From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler by E.L. Konigsburg

When Claudia decided to run away, she planned very carefully. She would be gone just long enough to teach her parents a lesson in Claudia appreciation. And she would go in comfort - she would live at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. She saved her money, and she invited her brother Jamie to go, mostly because he was a miser and would have money.

The Case of the Windy Lake (Mighty Muskrats series) by Michael Hutchinson

Sam, Otter, Atim, and Chickadee are four inseparable cousins growing up on the Windy Lake First Nation. Nicknamed the Mighty Muskrats for their habit of laughing, fighting, and exploring together, the cousins find that each new adventure adds to their reputation. When a visiting archaeologist goes missing, the cousins decide to solve the mystery of his disappearance. In the midst of community conflict, family concerns, and environmental protests, the four get busy following every lead.

Tower Treasure (Hardy Boys mysteries) by Franklin Dixon

A dying criminal confesses that his loot has been stored "in the tower." Both towers of the looted mansion are searched in vain. It remains for the Hardy boys to make an astonishing discovery that clears up the mystery and clears the name of a friend's father.

The Secret of the Old Clock (Nancy Drew mysteries) by Carolyn Keene



All-of-a-Kind Family (series) by Sydney Taylor

Firekeeper's Daughter by Angeline Boulley

Eighteen-year-old Daunis Fontaine has never quite fit in, both in her hometown and on the nearby Ojibwe reservation. She dreams of a fresh start at college, but when family tragedy strikes, Daunis puts her future on hold to look after her fragile mother. The only bright spot is meeting Jamie, the charming new recruit on her brother Levi's hockey team.

The Inheritance Games (series) by Jennifer Lynn Barnes

Avery Grambs has a plan for a better future: survive high school, win a scholarship, and get out. But her fortunes change in an instant when billionaire Tobias Hawthorne dies and leaves Avery virtually his entire fortune. The catch? Avery has no idea why -- or even who Tobias Hawthorne is.

They Went Left by Monica Hesse

Germany, 1945. The soldiers who liberated the Gross-Rosen concentration camp said the war was over, but nothing feels over to eighteen-year-old Zofia Lederman. Her body has barely begun to heal, her mind feels broken. And her life is completely shattered: Three years ago, she and her younger brother, Abek, were the only members of their family to be sent to the right, away from the gas chambers of Auschwitz-Birkenau.

Truly Devious (series) by Maureen Johnson

True-crime aficionado Stevie Bell is set to begin her first year at Ellingham Academy, and she has an ambitious plan: She will solve this cold case. That is, she will solve the case when she gets a grip on her demanding new school life and her housemates: the inventor, the novelist, the actor, the artist, and the jokester. But something strange is happening. Truly Devious makes a surprise return, and death revisits Ellingham Academy. The past has crawled out of its grave. Someone has gotten away with murder.

Trouble is a Friend of Mine by Stephanie Tromly

Sherlock meets Veronica Mars meets Ferris Bueller's Day Off in this story of a wisecracking girl who meets a weird but brilliant boy and their roller-coaster of a semester that's one part awkward, three parts thrilling, and five parts awesome.

The Screaming Staircase (Lockwood & Co. series)

Lucy Carlyle teams up with Anthony Lockwood, the charismatic leader of Lockwood & Co., a small agency that runs independent of any adult supervision. After an assignment leads to both a grisly discovery and a disastrous end, Lucy, Anthony, and their sarcastic colleague, George, are forced to take part in the perilous investigation of Combe Carey Hall, one of the most haunted houses in England. Will Lockwood & Co. survive the Hall's legendary Screaming Staircase and Red Room to see another day?

Adult Books

Murder on the Orient Express by Agatha Christie

Just after midnight, the famous Orient Express is stopped in its tracks by a snowdrift. By morning, the millionaire Samuel Edward Ratchett lies dead in his compartment, stabbed a dozen times, his door locked from the inside. Without a shred of doubt, one of his fellow passengers is the murderer. Isolated by the storm, detective Hercule Poirot must find the killer among a dozen of the dead man's enemies, before the murderer decides to strike again.

Around the World in 80 Trains by Monisha Rajesh

But it wasn't long before she was carefully plotting a route that would cover 45,000 miles - almost twice the circumference of the earth - coasting along the world's most remarkable railways; from the cloud-skimming heights of Tibet's Qinghai railway to silk-sheeted splendour on the Venice Simplon-Orient-Express.

Where the Crawdads Sing by Delia Owens

For years, rumors of the "Marsh Girl" have haunted Barkley Cove, a quiet town on the North Carolina coast. So, in late 1969, when handsome Chase Andrews is found dead, the locals immediately suspect Kya Clark, the so-called Marsh Girl. But Kya is not what they say.

A Gentleman in Moscow

In 1922, Count Alexander Rostov is deemed an unrepentant aristocrat by a Bolshevik tribunal, and is sentenced to house arrest in the Metropol, a grand hotel across the street from the Kremlin. Rostov, an indomitable man of erudition and wit, has never worked a day in his life, and must now live in an attic room while some of the most tumultuous decades in Russian history are unfolding outside the hotel's doors. Unexpectedly, his reduced circumstances provide him entry into a much larger world of emotional discovery.

The Boxcar Children (2014)

Four orphaned and homeless siblings happen upon an abandoned boxcar, which, with a little creativity and hard work, they gradually furnish with all the comforts of home. Fearful that they will be sent to live with the reputedly cruel grandfather they have never met, the children keep their new home a secret.

James and the Giant Peach (1996)

An adaptation of Roald Dahl's fantasy about a boy, tended by two aunts, who discovers a magic pathway inside a giant peach. Together with some insect friends, he sets sail for the city of his dreams.

The Little Prince (2016)

A downed pilot encounters a tiny prince from a mysterious, faraway place. The first-ever animated feature film adaptation of Antoine de Saint-Exupery's beloved timeless classic tale of innocence and discovery.

Nim's Island (2008)

Nim Rusoe is a young girl who inhabits an isolated island with her scientist father and communicates, via email, with the reclusive author of the novel she has been reading. Nim's existence mirrors that of her favorite literary character, Alex Rover, the world's greatest adventurer. But Alexandra, the author of the Rover books, leads a reclusive life in the big city. When Nim's father goes missing from the island, Nim gets Alexandra to come to her island. Now, the two must draw courage from their fictional hero, Alex Rover, and find strength in one another to conquer the island.


