

AND THEN THEY CAME FOR ME

REMEMBERING THE WORLD OF ANNE FRANK

EVA GEIRINGER SCHLOSS

After the war, when my mother and I returned to Amsterdam, I found it very hard to accept that my father and brother were never to come back. From that moment I have had a special dream. It was that our family, which had socially been destroyed, would be reunited again, even if it were only in a film, or on the stage.

So, when Susan Kerner approached me out of the blue, to ask whether I would be interested to cooperate in a play about several Holocaust families, I knew that my dream was coming true. Meanwhile, I had become increasingly involved in Holocaust Education. I have spent much time talking to young people especially, mainly in schools. I fear greatly that the lessons of the past may be forgotten, if only because we all tend to push aside what is unpleasant. Therefore, it seems to me very important that the surviving witnesses should continue to testify.

I welcome the success of *And Then They Came for Me* for both these reasons. It allows me to share my family with audiences all over the U.S.A., and in other countries too. Also, the memory of the Holocaust is recreated vividly and convincingly in the play. I have watched very many performances and each time have been very moved by the deeply felt interpretation of the young actors and their portrayal of the humiliation, degradation and pain our families had to endure. The strong impact on the audience, which is visible after each performance, comes as no surprise.

I am very fortunate to have been privileged to work with a playwright as gifted and as sensitive as James Still and with an inspired director as Susan Kerner. Many thanks to them also for having given me the opportunity to meet so many wonderful people involved in various ways with the creation and performance of the play.

ED SILVERBERG

And Then They Came for Me has given me the opportunity, after fifty years of relative silence, to reflect on and to speak about my experience as a young boy during Hitler's Holocaust years.

In 1942, at the age of 16, I befriended Anne Frank for a few short weeks before she and her family went into hiding. For me she has come to represent the many school friends and childhood playmates who perished at the hands of the Nazis.

It is my hope that this moving play will enable an ever-growing audience the world over to carry on the memory of Anne Frank. It is, after all, the next generation that must keep alive the knowledge of this dark episode in human history, so that it may never be repeated...

PLAYWRIGHT

This is a play about questions. Some of the questions seem unspeakable. Admittedly, many of the questions are unanswerable. Even so, that doesn't diminish the importance of asking the questions.

Although there are many philosophies and passionate points of view within the field of Holocaust Education please approach this as a play; not as a "Holocaust play" but as a play about people who lived during the Holocaust. It is a subtle yet important distinction. This is not a "history play," it is a play about families and their histories.

I am a writer who vividly remembers reading Anne Frank's diary the first time at the age of 12. Something stirred inside me-still stirred inside me years later as I worked on this project. I hope that as the years continue to faithfully mark all of the anniversaries connected to World War II, that audiences will remember Anne and Ed and Eva and their experiences as young people during the Holocaust. The only way that we will remember the Holocaust is if we hear from the people who were actually there. Then, I'm convinced, we'll never be able to forget.

And thank you to Eva Schloss and Ed Silverberg for talking to a kid from a small town in Kansas who was born years after the war ended, for trusting me with your precious stories, and for teaching me more than you'll ever know.

AUDIO DESCRIPTION PERFORMANCE

The last Sunday of each production with On-Stage Pre-Show, Actor Voice ID, and/or Touch Tour at 1:30 PM, Audio Pre-Show at 2:15 PM, and Performance at 2:30 PM

Audio Description (or AD) helps to make visual imagery accessible to people who are blind, with low vision, or vision loss. Visual elements can include costumes, sets, and character appearances, along with action, gestures, facial expressions, and other visually important images. It's used to enhance understanding and enjoyment of the live performance.

Nathan Ruggles Audio Describer

Nathan has provided Audio Description (AD) services for Prime Stage patrons who are blind and visually impaired since 2017. Together they received the 2022 Award for Achievement in Audio Description for Theater from The American Council of the Blind (ACB). Founder and Principal of Audio Describe Pittsburgh!, he provides AD for the Pittsburgh Cultural Trust Broadway Series and Pittsburgh CLO, and serves theaters and venues in the greater Pittsburgh area and beyond. He has also worked with organizations such as Film Pittsburgh, the Children's Museum, Andy Warhol Museum, Greater Pittsburgh Arts Council, and the Pennsylvania Council on the Arts. He has trained through the Audio Description Institute, Audio Description Access, Audio Description Coalition, VSA Pennsylvania, and the Kennedy Center Leadership Exchange in Arts and Disability (LEAD). Beyond writing and narration, he furnishes comprehensive services that include recording, consulting, and technical support, bringing his unique background in professional stage acting, voice over, broadcast radio, podcast production, arts administration, political advocacy, and radio reading services. Number the Stars by Lois Lowry

In 1943, during the German occupation of Denmark, ten-year-old Annemarie learns how to be brave and courageous when she helps shelter her Jewish friend from the Nazis.

Lisa of Willesden Lane by Mona Golabek

The true story of a girl who traveled on the Kindertransport during World War II and her experiences during a time of war.

Hidden (Graphic Novel) by Loic Dauvillier

A grandmother shares the story of her experiences in WWII with her grandchild in this graphic novel for young readers.

Teen Books

American Shoes by Rosemarie Lengsfeld Turke

Recounts the tumultuous childhood of a young American girl growing up in the clutches of Nazi Germany.

This Rebel Heart by Katherine Locke

A tumultuous tale of the student-led 1956 Hungarian revolution – and an all too timely look at the impact of Communism and the USSR in Eastern Europe post WWII.

The Book Thief by Markus Zusak

The Boys Who Challenged Hitler by Phillip M. Hoose

The true story of a group of boy resistance fighters in Denmark during Nazi occupation during WWII.

Adult Books

The Betrayal of Anne Frank by Rosemary Sullivan

Using new technology, recently discovered documents, and sophisticated investigative techniques, an international team has finally solved the mystery that has haunted generations since WWII: who betrayed Anne Frank and her family-and why? Rosemary Sullivan introduces us to the investigators, explains the behavior of both the captives and their captors and profiles a group of suspects. All the while, she vividly brings to life wartime Amsterdam: a place where no matter how wealthy, educated, or careful you were, you never knew whom you could trust.

Adapted for the BBC, one of the most powerful, personal accounts of World War II ever recorded- based on the novel of the same name. (*Rated TV-PG*)

Everything is Illuminated (2006)

A young American man, with the help of a local guide who speaks broken English, journeys to find the women who saved his grandfather during WWII in a Ukrainian village that had been raided by the Nazis. (Rated PG-13)

The Zookeeper's Wife (2017)

The real-life story of one working wife and mother who became a hero to hundreds during World War II. (*Rated PG-13*)


