The ideal vision of thriving in the arts and culture ecosystem is creating art for all people and to speak to everyday issues with art in sought of liberation in this system of American culture.

**Teaira Whitehead** the play is my personal message to Pittsburgh, my hometown. This play is a capsule of emotions I carried as a



child. Tearia Whitehead's death and the way the city ignored it not only impacted me but a larger community in Pittsburgh. In creating this play I have aligned myself with those who feel the city should have done more or at least investigated it. Black children here in Pittsburgh face such a high degree of racism. This is my way of fighting back against that racism. Black children are the future. In capturing the humanity and joy Black children naturally have in this play, I place different memories, games and the way I use to play with my friends in this production. I wanted to capture how important friendships are and the strength of empathy.

In partnership of this play, The Afro Healing Tree is a Traveling Community Tree House. My goal for the tree is to hold space all over the City of Pittsburgh, to hold space dedicated to the mental health of Black children. Currently this tree was able to serve over 500 people in holding physical space for Black children's mental health at Assemble Pgh, The Mattress Factory educational program and Art All Night.
