Plots come to me at such odd moments, when I am walking along the street, or examining a hat shop...suddenly a splendid idea comes into my head.

- Agatha Christie, An Autobiography



Spending most of her time with imaginary friends, Agatha Clarissa Miller's unconventional childhood fostered an extraordinary imagination. Against her mother's wishes, she taught herself to read and had little or no formal education until the age of fifteen or sixteen when she was sent to a finishing school in Paris.

Agatha Christie always said that she had no ambition to be a writer although she made her debut in print at the age of eleven with a poem printed in a local London newspaper. Finding herself in bed with influenza, her mother suggested she write down the stories she was so fond of telling. And so a lifelong passion began. By her late teens she had had several poems published in The Poetry Review and had written a number of short stories. But it was her sister's challenge to write a detective story that would later spark what would become her illustrious career.

Agatha Christie wrote about the world she knew and saw, drawing on the military gentlemen, lords and ladies, spinsters, widows and doctors of her family's circle of friends and acquaintances. She was a natural observer and her descriptions of village politics, local rivalries and family jealousies are often painfully accurate. Mathew Prichard describes her as a "person who listened more than she talked, who saw more than she was seen."

The most everyday events and casual observations could trigger the idea for a new plot. Her second book The Secret Adversary stemmed from a conversation overheard in a tea shop: "Two people were talking at a table nearby, discussing somebody called Jane Fish... That, I thought, would make a good beginning to a story — a name overheard at a tea shop — an unusual name, so that whoever heard it remembered it. A name like Jane Fish, or perhaps Jane Finn would be even better."

And how were these ideas turned into novels? She made endless notes in dozens of notebooks, jotting down erratic ideas and potential plots and characters as they came to her "I usually have about half a dozen (notebooks) on hand and I used to make notes in them of ideas that struck me, or about some poison or drug, or a clever little bit of swindling that I had read about in the paper".



THE POWER AND INFLUENCE OF LIVE PERFORMACE

Why Theatre Continues to Contribute Significantly to Society

The power and influence of live performance in society cannot be undermined. For centuries, theatre has played an essential role in the lives of people all around the world. It is a hub for entertainment, culture, and creativity, where artists and audiences come together in a shared experience. Live performance has profound emotional and psychological effects on audiences, eliciting various responses that ultimately contribute to society's growth and development.

Prime Stage is fortunate to have a fantastic design staff to make the theatre experience as true as possible based on the script, the director, and our budget. When you're watching the production, please observe the set, costumes, lights, sounds and props and let us know what you think by emailing

The approach for the scenic design for **Witness for the Prosecution** is to convey the grandeur and overall scale of the Old Bailey by using as much of the theatre to stage the play. Actors occupy the upper balconies of the theater to observe the drama that unfolds in the courtroom as others sit alongside the audience in the jury box. Large courthouse windows and an ornate pediment tower over the on-stage players creating a sense of looming power, while worn wooden furniture and the warm glow of green-glass lamps ground the characters in comfort to their surroundings.

The costume design for **Witness for the Prosecution** is to place the emphasis upon grounding us in our time period. Additionally, as a team we worked to accurately portray the specific nuances of British Court Dress as closely as possible.

The lighting design for **Witness for the Prosecution** acknowledges the theatrical nature of Agatha Christie's work while remaining grounded in the realism of the world that her characters inhabit.

The sound design for **Witness for the Prosecution** is to keep the sound design very realistic, accurate, and practical. The biggest project will be creating 1950's BBC-style radio broadcasts to air at various points during the show. My goal is to keep the audience engaged with "radio coverage" of the trial while also providing a practical use for scene changes.

While building and sourcing props and furniture for **Witness for the Prosecution**, the focus was on staying true to the time period and setting. From the banker's lamps to the various paperwork, everything is as true to the period as possible.

Lisa Bansavage Dialect Coach

Lisa is delighted to be working on her ninth production with Prime Stage Theatre. As an actor, her career spans Broadway, Off Broadway, regional theatre, film, television and national commercial credits including *Master Class*, *Sideman*, *Turn of the Screw*, *A Man for All Seasons*, *The Grapes of Wrath*, *Grace & Glorie*, *Mastergate*, *Red Scare on Sunset*, *The Changeling*, *The Country Wife*, *A View from the Bridge*, *The Beauty Queen of Leenane*, *The Sisters Rosenweig*, *Night of the Iguana*, *Mississippi Burning*, *Married to the Mob*, *Three Men and a Baby*, *The Fisher King*, *Diary of Anne Frank*, *The Loman Family Picnic* and a third of the full Shakespearean canon as well as a role opposite Sir Anthony Quayle in the BBC-London production of *An Exchange of Gifts*. He has trained through the Audio Description Institute, Audio Description Access, Audio Description Coalition, VSA Pennsylvania, and the Kennedy Center Leadership Exchange in Arts and Disability (LEAD). Beyond writing and narration, he furnishes comprehensive services that include recording, consulting, and technical support, bringing his unique background in professional stage acting, voice over, broadcast radio, podcast production, arts administration, political advocacy, and radio reading services. 
