

this play tests the idea of queerness in solitude vs. queerness in community.

so much of how i understand myself is a direct result of the queer and trans people of my past, present, and future.

not every george in this world is lucky enough to have a morrison, a caring audience, a spotlight at the end of the tunnel.

not every george accepts these treasures.

not every george understands that control shuts down community.

how you see this play will never be exactly replicated, but you have people to reflect upon it with.

hint: they're sitting right next to you.

theatre is by definition experienced in community.

i find the same to be true about its creation.

how lucky am i to share the creation of this piece with this team.

"thank you" will never be a large enough acknowledgement.

i hope the art is.
